


















- Numerous tiny islands a short boat ride from the harbour

- Full and half-day guided tours can be organised




















116 km return trip

- Majestic scenery, deep lochs, mountainous peaks and pristine beaches dot the stunning landscape















Leckmelm Arboretum
8 km return trip

- Beautiful sheltered oasis, minutes from Ullapool village
- Planted in the 1880s, teeming with rare species of azalea, rhododendron, alpine plants and specimen trees









Lael Forest Walk 32 km return trip

- Easy, pleasant routes for walkers of even limited experience
- Over 200 clearly-identified tree species Giant Redwoods, Cricket Bat Willows and Lawson Cypress
- Plenty of benches and resting spots along the way

Gruinard Sands
120 km return trip

- Perfect stop-off on day trip to Inverewe Gardens
- Pristine sandy beach magnificent views over rocky Highland landscapes







Inverewe Gardens
160 km return trip

- Lush, colourful and exotic plants despite northerly latitude
- Full-day trip with stop-off points en-route including Leckmelm Arboretum,
 Falls of Measach and Gruinard Sands









Castle Leod
128 km return

- Home to current chief of Clan Mackenzie who gives his own guided tours
- Spanish Chestnut planted in 1550 for Mary of Guise, mother of Mary Queen of Scots
- Adjacent to picturesque Victorian spa town of Strathpeffer









Glen Ord Distillery
142 km return

- One of Scotland's oldest distilleries built 1838, west of Inverness
- Guided tours available to watch distillers at work making sweet malty dry whisky
- Opportunity to visit distillery shop







Castle Urquhart
192 km return

- Outstanding views of the world-famous loch and Great Glen
- Exhibition, audio-visual display and tearoom in nearby visitor centre
- Perfect look-out spot for monster spotting!
